In the early morning hours of December 5, 1971 Cyril James Terna and Ruth Frances (Hofrichter) Terna welcomed Scott Andrew Kalaimoku Terna into the world at Kapiolani Children's Hospital in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

After growing up in the 50th State and an illustrious athletic career at Punahou School, Scott chose to bypass scholarship offers in baseball and football in order to return to his roots and attend his parent's alma mater; The Ohio State University. Scott's plan was to walk on to the football team in the Spring of 1991. Scott earned the starting punting job in 1993 and finished his career the following year by earning All Conference Honors and The Ike Kelley Award which is given annually to Ohio State's Best Special Teams Player as voted by the Coaching Staff.

In the following years Scott obtained a stagehand job with ESPN's College Gameday while continuing his NFL pursuits. It was in his years with ESPN that Scott discovered his love for photographing sports. Originally, he wanted to follow his mentor, Phil Jacques, in becoming a cameraman. However, limited opportunities led him to still photography. Visiting marquee college football games every weekend was the perfect classroom to hone his craft.

After the 2002 football season Scott started his own action sports photography business; Forever Young Images. It was in Hawaii where Scott perfected his skills under Mark Miyoshi and his company Rebel Shots.com. Scott was instrumental in helping make Rebel Shots the premiere sports photography company throughout the 50th State covering youth and high school sports. Aside from working with Rebel Shots, Scott did some freelance work for the Honolulu Advertiser by following local sports action including the Hawaii Warrior football team and has covered 4 NFL Pro Bowls.

Scott's photographic resume includes being a personal photographer to Ohio State Football parents, a photo contributor to former Ohio State coach Jim Tressel's website, as well as an assignment photographer for This Week In Football Magazine. He's also been published in just about all the major sports magazines nationally.

Since 2007 Scott and his team of photographers have brought a new aspect to action sports photography which caters to the general public with Shot In Action Photography; a company which Scott say, "is geared towards clients who want top quality action photos of their athletes with unmatched personal service." Commenting on how Shot In Action is different from other companies that continually pop up Scott summarized in saying, "We're on top of the latest technology and the latest photo products that can be made available to our customers.
